

***COLUBER CONSTRICTOR* (North American Racer)**. USA: NEBRASKA: HOLT Co.: Redbird Wildlife Management Area, parking area along 503rd Ave (42.75602°N, 98.43941°W; WGS 84). 17 October 2015. Drew R. Davis. Verified by Jessa L. Watters. Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History (OMNH 44464 [DRD 2352]). New county record filling a gap in the known distribution of this species in northern Nebraska (Ballinger et al. 2010. Amphibians and Reptiles of Nebraska. Rusty Lizard Press, Oro Valley, Arizona. 400 pp.; Fogell 2010. A Field Guide to the Amphibians and Reptiles of Nebraska. University of Nebraska–Lincoln, Lincoln, Nebraska. 158 pp.); species is otherwise known from the surrounding counties of Antelope, Boyd, Knox, Rock, and Garfield (Ballinger et al. 2010, *op. cit.*; Fogell 2010, *op. cit.*; Johannsen et al. 2016. Herpetol. Rev. 47:260). The nearest known locality for this species is ca. 18 km to the northwest, from west of Bristow, Boyd Co., Nebraska (USNM 82015). Juvenile male

(9.4 g; 269 mm SVL; 85 mm tail length) collected at 1516 h. Additional unpublished records for this species exist throughout Holt Co. (Charles R. Conner Museum, Washington State University [CRCM] 41-311, 41-315, 41-316). Specimen collected under a Nebraska Game and Parks Commission Scientific and Educational Permit (#545) issued to DRD.
