

***THAMNOPHIS SIRTALIS* (Common Gartersnake).** USA: NEBRASKA: BOYD Co.: NE Hwy 12, 0.2 rd km W jct 504 Ave, east of Lynch, Nebraska (42.83002°N, 98.42445°W; WGS 84). 17 October 2015. Drew R. Davis. Verified by Jessa L. Watters. Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History (OMNH 44466 [DRD 2343]). New county record filling a gap in the known distribution of this species in northern Nebraska (Ballinger et al. 2010. *Amphibians and Reptiles of Nebraska*. Rusty Lizard Press, Oro Valley, Arizona. 400 pp.; Fogell 2010. *A Field Guide to the Amphibians and Reptiles of Nebraska*. University of Nebraska–Lincoln, Lincoln, Nebraska. 158 pp.). Hudson (1942. *Nebr. Conserv. Bull* 24:1–146) remarked that an individual had been observed “6 mi S of Butte” in Boyd Co., but noted that this specimen was not preserved. The nearest known locality for this species is ca. 22.8 km to the east-southeast from west of Niobrara, Knox Co., Nebraska (USNM 82016). Adult female (98.75 g; 635 mm SVL; 165 mm tail length) collected DOR at 1348 h. Specimen collected under a Nebraska Game and Parks Commission Scientific and Educational Permit (#545) issued to DRD.
