

**ERRATUM**

In a recently published geographic distribution note (Davis and DeSantis 2012. *Herpetol. Rev.* 43[2]:449), we identified two snakes in the Texas Natural History Collections (TNHC 85172, 85173) as *Pantherophis emoryi*. However, subsequent examination of TNHC specimens of *P. emoryi*, *P. guttatus*, and *P. slowinskii*, and consultation with Travis LaDuc suggests that our earlier specimens should be referred to *P. slowinskii* instead. Assignment to species based on external characters in this region of range overlap is difficult. Even with this change of species assignment, these specimens represent a new record for Fayette Co. (Dixon 2000. *Amphibians and Reptiles of Texas*. Texas A&M University Press, College Station. 421 pp.).
