

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

Biodiversity Collections, University of Texas at Austin (TNHC 114080 [DRD 5923]). An adult individual (0.62 g, 21 mm SVL) was captured by hand in a planted area outside of the Rockport-Fulton Middle School at 0030 h. New county record for this species in Texas (Dixon 2013. *Amphibians and Reptiles of Texas: with Keys, Taxonomic Synopses, Bibliography, and Distribution Maps*. Third Edition. Texas A&M University Press, College Station, Texas. viii + 447 pp.). *Eleutherodactylus cystignathoides* has been introduced widely across counties in central and eastern Texas and is known from adjacent San Patricio County (Dixon 2013, *op. cit.*). The nearest known record to this individual is from ca. 78 km to the northwest from near Beeville, Bee County, Texas (Biodiversity Research and Teaching Collections, Texas A&M University [TCWC] 93074). This specimen was collected under a Texas Parks and Wildlife Scientific Collecting Permit (SPR-1018-294) issued to DRD.
