

***SALVADORA GRAHAMIAE* (Eastern Patch-nosed Snake).** USA: TEXAS: JIM WELLS Co.: private property along E TX Hwy 44 (TX Hwy 359), ca. 1.0 rd km NE jct Co Rd 341 (27.77275°N, 98.02787°W; WGS 84). 11 January 2021. Clinton J. Guadiana and Drew R. Davis. Verified by Travis J. LaDuc. Biodiversity Collections, University of Texas at Austin (TNHC 115320 [DRD 7303]). Adult male (448 mm SVL, 119 mm tail length [incomplete], 28.8 g) collected under debris at 1440 h. This specimen represents a new county record (Dixon 2013. *Amphibians and Reptiles of Texas: with Keys, Taxonomic Synopses, Bibliography, and Distribution Maps*. Third edition. Texas A&M University Press, College Station, Texas. viii + 447 pp.) and fills the remaining gap in the species' recognized distribution in the region. *Salvadora grahamiae* is known from all surrounding counties (Dixon 2013), and the nearest known specimen record is ca. 30.8 km to the southeast in Nueces County (Biodiversity Research and Teaching Collections, Texas A&M University [TCWC] 33953). This specimen was collected under a Texas Parks and Wildlife Scientific Collecting Permit (SPR-1018-294) issued to DRD and an approved IACUC protocol (UTRGV AUP #18-28).
